

Dear Smoky Hill High School Students and Parents,

The Cherry Creek School District would like to share with you the Concurrent Enrollment and other postsecondary course opportunities that are available to Smoky Hill High School students.

The Concurrent Enrollment (CE) program allows qualified high school students in grades 9-12 to enroll in college courses and earn college credits at no cost to them for tuition. The College Opportunity Fund (COF) and the Cherry Creek School District will pay the tuition portion for CE college courses at the local community college tuition rate on behalf of the student.

These courses are taught in our CCSD high schools by teachers approved as adjunct instructors with the community colleges. Students will receive both high school and community college credit.

Qualified students can enroll in college academic and/or career and technical education (CTE) courses. CE programs may help students significantly reduce college expenses, increase the likelihood of completing college, and develop knowledge and skills necessary to be ready for college and the workforce.

Smoky Hill High School also has a few other postsecondary courses that are available for students, which do have a low cost tuition rate associated with them.
